One of the things that I will miss when I retire is teaching people about the Christian Church Year (Which I did in an adult instruction class that was finished right before Easter). I love to tell people about each of the seasons and the rites and rituals and traditions associated with them. It's the rites and rituals and traditions that help bind us together; they serve as visual and hands-on lessons concerning our walk with Christ and the salvation that he came to bring us through his death and resurrection.

During the season of Lent Teryl and I like to wrap purple ribbon around all the crosses around the house. We have one cross that spells out John 3:16. She puts a purple ribbon around that one and hangs it on our front door rather than a wreath. It also makes for a nice witness as people drive or walk by and look at our front door.

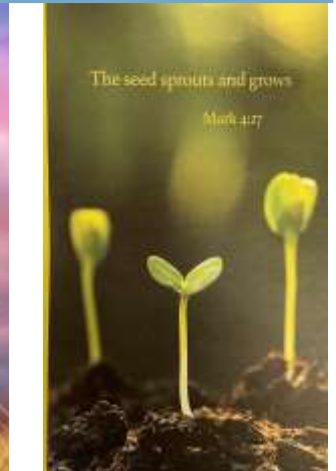
During Advent we put an Advent wreath on our dining room table and use it for our Advent devotions. But we also like decorating the house in blue, the color of Advent, because it signifies hope. Christ came into the world to give us a sure and certain hope! We also like hanging the prayer, Come Lord Jesus, over our dining room windows—one letter on a triangle piece of paper for each letter in the phrase.

It's a reminder, not to pray before we eat, but look forward with eager expectation for Jesus to come again and take us to be with him in paradise.

These are all easy because we do very similar things at church. Adapting them at home is easy and fun to do and certainly brings meaning for us about the current season of the church year we are observing. Celebrating the Church Year at home helps us to focus our faith on our Lord as "more-than-on-Sunday thing"! Our faith, along with Christ in whom we put our faith and trust, comes homes with us; we share our faith—our common bond with Him—with each other.

We also have a couple of books that are on the same subject of observing the Church Year at home. They are, "A Book of Feasts and Seasons" by Joanna Bogle, and "A Continual Feast" by Evelyn Birge Vitz. You can also do internet searches on this as well. Our books provide decorating advice, meals to eat, and activities for children if you have them still at home.

Who's in Charge

As I sit and listen and watch the daily news, all I can do is shake my head. Then I **start to think just who is in charge, because we humans think that we are. I don't think** it is supposed to be this way. I remember a devotional story that I read from David Jeremiah where part of the story started out like this:

A large log was swept from the bank of a very fast-flowing river and is hurtling through the rapids (think of this log as our world). On this large log are thousands of tiny ants, *all of whom think they are in control of the log* (think of it as we are the ants).

Can you think of anything more absurd than for a tiny ant to think that it is in charge or in control of this giant log as it is careening on the waves of a raging river? And yet, so often men and women think that they have what it takes to change the outcome of this tumultuous world in which we live in. We often try to change things to what we think is the best outcome. However, the Bible tells us the complete opposite. This world belongs to God, and God alone. Only God can work out His purposes for the world which He created. The people throughout the scriptures believed just as we believe; that God rules over all as it says in (Deuteronomy 32:8 and in Job 12:23). The prophets also held this belief as stated by the Prophet Daniel. In (Daniel 2:20-22) he shared these words ***"Praise be to the name of God for ever and ever; wisdom and power are his.²¹ He changes times and seasons; he deposes kings and raises up others. He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the discerning.²² He reveals deep and hidden things; he knows what lies in darkness, and light dwells with him."*** The Apostles shared these words from Acts 17:26 ***"From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands."***

Don't let the events and the evil in our sinful and fallen world create fear in your heart. Remember that God has *been, is,* and will *always* remain on the throne ruling His creation.

Nothing is beyond [God's] control.... The Bible makes it very clear that God is in control of everything. Even though we might not understand, have Faith that He is.

EASTER IS NEVER OVER FOR CHRISTIANS

Did you know that? Luther emphasizes in the Small Catechism that Baptism, " signifies that the Old Adam in us should, by daily contrition and repentance, be drowned and die with all sins and evil lusts and, again, a new man daily come forth and arise, who shall live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

How is this possible? "St. Paul writes, Romans, chapter 6: "We are buried with Christ by Baptism into death, that, like as He was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Fa-

ther, even so we also should walk in newness of life" - in other words, our sins are forgiven and now we have a chance to walk in ways pleasing to our Savior. That makes every new day another Easter for us.

The early church celebrated Easter for 40 days, recognizing that Christ continued to prove Himself the promised Savior in interaction with His disciples for 40 days, and prepared them for their "assignment" to take the wonderful message into all the world so that God's Plan of Salvation would be successfully completed. That is still our assignment today. So we reviewed that Plan in the words of "Jesus Loves me" once again.

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY will be Saturday, May 14th beginning at 9:15am. Please join us and invite a friend!



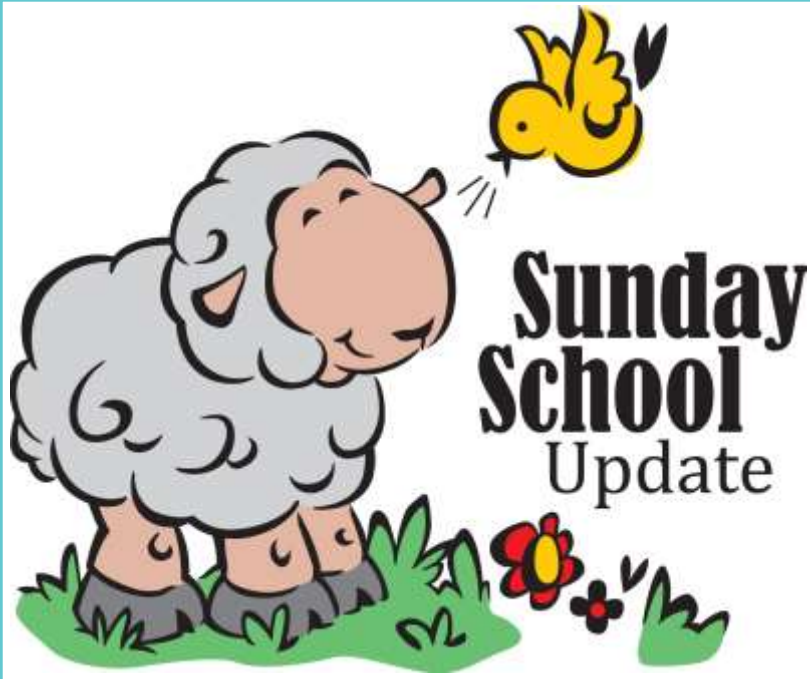
FOG (FAMILY OF GOD)
