# "Teach Us to Pray" by Elder Steve Northcott and Pastor Eric

Maybe you've prayed this prayer before:

"So far today, God, I've done all right. I haven't gossiped, haven't lost my temper, haven't been greedy, grumpy, nasty, selfish, or over-indulgent. I'm really glad about that. But in a few minutes, God, I'm going to get out of bed and from then on, I'm probably going to need a lot more help. Thank you. In Jesus name. Amen."

Jesus' disciples asked him to teach them how to pray. Jesus gave them what we commonly call the Lord's Prayer. See Matthew 6:9-13. There are 7 petitions (besides the introduction and conclusion) within the Lord's Prayer, listed below and further explained in Luther's Small Catechism:

- 1. Hallowed be Thy Name
- 2. Thy Kingdom come
- 3. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven
- 4. Give us this day our daily bread
- 5. Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us

- 6. Lead us not into temptation
- 7. Deliver us from evil

Martin Luther provides for a morning and evening prayer structure that includes an invocation and signing of the Triune Name, the Lord's Prayer, reciting the Creed and an general prayer for the time of day.

The Scriptures also admonish us to pray with thanksgiving, presenting our requests to God and interceding for others as well. (See Luke 18:1-8, James 4:2-3, Ephesians 6:18, 1 Timothy 2:1)

There are other modern structures that can help you pray. Consider the acronym A.C.T.S. When you pray, proceed through the letters A-C-T-S as described below.

**A** stands for Adoration. Start your prayer by praising God for who He is, his attributes or his works. Some of the well-known attributes and descriptions of God: all-powerful, all-knowing, present everywhere, loving, creator, mighty, just, merciful, gracious, patient, good and faithful. Read the Psalms for ideas. Read Exodus 15, Isaiah 12, Revelation 4:8-11; 5:11-14 and 7:10-12.

C stands for Contrition. Next repent of your sins. These can be personal sins, corporate sins, even unknown sins. It is advisable to admit our spiritual poverty to God and to one another, seeking the forgiveness that God readily gives us in Christ.

**T** stands for Thanksgiving. Thank God for His many blessings given to us – past present and future. God gives us life, health, daily bread, employment, possessions, family, friends, freedom, etc. God gives us Christ's righteousness and removes our sins. God adopts us into His family through Baptism. Jesus is preparing a place for each of us in Heaven. Each person has much to be thankful for.

**S** stands for Supplication. This is the part of the prayer where we ask God to supply something. This is not a wish list for Santa Claus. We pray that God would grant us specific requests according to His will. God knows what we really need in every situation. Therefore, ask your petitions boldly, and pray that God answers you according to His will. Remember that "the prayer of a righteous man availeth much" James 5:16 KJV

Another acronym is P.R.A.Y.  $\mathbf{P}$  is for praise,  $\mathbf{R}$  is for repent,  $\mathbf{A}$  is for asking God's help for others, and  $\mathbf{Y}$  is for your own needs and yielding to God's will.

Someone once said that God's answers to prayer are either: Yes, No, or Wait.

Many times, waiting upon the Lord is what we need to do, to trust Him. In the meantime, we try our best to do the good works that God has set-up in advance for us to do. If you are not sure what these works are, ask God to show you what he wants you to do. Then pay attention and be ready to follow.

## **ELDERS' CORNER**

### A TIME FOR THANKS

So, let me ask you, what are you thankful for? We gather every year at this time to reflect on the blessings of God over the past year. But in many families, Thanksgiving is less about real gratitude and more about stuffing your face, watching football, and hanging out with the family. Some actually dread Thanksgiving, because of their life situation.

Now, I'm all in favor of the food and the football. But this year, let's make Thanksgiving about giving and about thanks. This year, more than any, might force us to dig deeper. For many, it will mark a year filled with unemployment issues, medical issues or maybe the loss of a loved one.

For many, this was a year marked by pain. So how do we summon gratitude? Well, if you're a Christian, your basis is not your circumstances, but something greater. Paul tells the people of Thessalonica (1 Thessalonians 5:18) that they should "give thanks in everything." Why? Because this was the "will of God in Christ Jesus."

In other words, followers of Christ believe that every piece of hardship is a grace gift from the Lord, sent for their growth, and to further intimacy with our almighty God. We don't believe we're here on this earth all alone. We believe God is firmly in charge.

Though life may get hard.... and it does.... it all falls under God's will. And so we give thanks.

As Americans, we really have cause for gratitude. I have to periodically remind myself of this. We so easily get caught up in the easy lust for more stuff. Bigger house, nicer car, better clothes, newest gadgets. But then as I drive around and see folks in real need, I feel humble.

Let's not sit around the table complaining about politics, complaining about our job, whining about how life is unfair. Let's instead reset our gratitude meters and offer genuine, heartfelt thanks to God for the **salvation** in Christ and for the daily care that He generously provides for our friends and family. Oh, and for wives that allow us to stuff our faces and watch football.

# **NEW HOPE FOOD PANTRY**

For the month of August, the Food Pantry served 52 families,172 people, gave 9 Bibles and 6 packages of diapers.


For the month of September, the Food Pantry served 35 families,133 people, and gave 37 units. We gave 8 Bibles and 2 packages of diapers.

The year-to-date totals through the month of September are 321 families, 1133 people served, 325 units, 52 Bibles and 40 packages of diapers.

We do not need any food contributions. We can use toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap and shampoo.

Plans are underway to give out 40 turkey food baskets for Thanksgiving. If your family or you know of a family that can use a basket of food for Thanksgiving, please call Joanne Vollbrecht. Names can be given anonymously. The baskets will each contain a turkey, a box of Stove Top dressing, 5 pounds of potatoes, bread or rolls, canned corn, canned green beans, cranberries, fresh apples, fresh oranges and a prebaked pie.

Help will be needed on Friday night, November 17th, at 7:00pm to pack the baskets. It takes less than one hour to

We will also need some assistance indoors to greet our guests and take the invitations which will be sent to them. This is very easy to do. Please call June Moore with questions. ### **MEN'S EVENT**




