Happy New Year! Blessed Epiphany Season!




Sunday School

Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML) *Mission Grants/Thank You*

ST. MARTIN LUTHERAN SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF,

Mission Grant #3 for \$25,000 is <u>PAID IN FULL.</u> St. Martin School for the Deaf was established by Ephphatha Lutheran Mission Society in 2018 to provide education for students in the Deaf and Hard of Hearing communities, including hearing children of Deaf adults with an emphasis on bilingual education in American Sign Language (ASL) and English. This grant gave scholarships to six students at St. Martin Lutheran School for the Deaf in Dearborn, Michigan for the biennium 2022-2024. Ephphatha Lutheran Mission Society is very thankful to the LWML Michigan District, for the grant of \$25,000 for the ministry to the Deaf. Thank you again and may God continue to bless you as you bless others.

LUTHERAN HERITAGE FOUNDATION, Mission Grant #5 for \$16,500 is also <u>PAID</u> <u>IN FULL</u>. This grant was for teenagers around the world. The Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF) created a new resource, 'God's Word for You,' a Bible storybook specially written at the teen level. This 300-page volume included an historic timeline and Gospel connection to Jesus. These books were provided to teens in Southeast Asia where Buddhist and atheist cultures have few resources to teach the faith to young people. The cost was only \$5.00 to print each storybook. This has enabled LHF to translate and publish 2,500 storybooks written in the language they can read. Rev. Dr. Matthew Heise, Exec. Director of the Lutheran Heritage Foundation, thanks the ladies of LWML, Michigan for helping to share God's Word with teens in places like Vietnam and Cambodia.

WOMEN'S SMALL BIBLE STUDY will meet Saturday, January 13th, at 9:30 am in the conference room. We are using the book, Promised Rest, Finding peace in God's presence by author Michelle Diercks. This is a study on the various names and characteristics of God to deepen your understanding of Him and your identity as His child. The names of God reveal important aspects of His character as well as how He relates to you and how He offers the peace we crave. Come and join us!

NEW HOPE FOOD PANTRY

For the month of November, New Hope Outreach Food Pantry served 57 families, 210 people, gave 58 units, 22 Bibles and 4 packages of diapers.

For Thanksgiving we gave 40 turkey food baskets, serving approximately 161 people. We gave 10 Bibles.

The year-to-date total through Thanksgiving is 458 families, approximately 1622 people, 463 units, 85 Bibles and 44 packages of diapers.

The items that we are in need of this month are any non-perishable foods and hygiene products. Thank you!
