Psalm 34:13: Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking deceit.

Psalm 37:30: The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom, and his tongue speaks justice.

Proverbs 4:24: Put away from you crooked speech, and put devious talk far from you.

Proverbs 11:13 He who goes about as a talebearer reveals secrets, but he who is trustworthy conceals a **matter.**"

Proverbs 12:18: There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

Proverbs 15:28: The heart of the righteous ponders how to answer, but the mouth of the wicked pours out evil things.

Proverbs 16:21: The wise of heart is called discerning, and sweetness of speech increases persuasiveness.

Proverbs 16:23: The heart of the wise makes his speech judicious and adds persuasiveness to his lips.

Proverbs 20:19 He who goes about as a slanderer reveals secrets, therefore do not associate with a gossip."

Proverbs 22:11: He who loves purity of heart, and whose speech is gracious, will have the king as his friend.

Proverbs 25:23: The north wind brings forth rain, and a backbiting tongue, angry looks.

Proverbs 25:9-10 ...don't reveal the secret of another, lest he who hears it reproach you, and the evil report about you not pass away."

Proverbs 26:28: A lying tongue hates its victims, and a flattering mouth works ruin.

Proverbs 28:23: Whoever rebukes a man will afterward find more favor than he who flatters with his tongue.

Ephesians 4:15: Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ,

Ephesians 4:25: Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another.

Ephesians 4:29-30: Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

Ephesians 5:4 Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving.

Colossians 3:8-9: But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices

Colossians 4:5-7: Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person.


1 Timothy 5:13: Besides that, they learn to be idlers, going about from house to house, and not only idlers, but also gossips and busybodies, saying what they should not.

2 Timothy 2:16 But avoid irreverent babble, for it will lead people into more and more ungodliness,

James 3:4-17: And if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body. If we put bits into the mouths of horses so that they obey us, we guide their whole bodies as well. Look at the ships also: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! And the tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell. For every kind of beast and bird, reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by mankind, but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so. Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and saltwater? Can a fig tree, my brothers, bear olives, or a grapevine produce figs? Neither can a salt pond yield fresh water. Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

James 4:11: Do not speak evil against one another, brothers. The one who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks evil against the law and judges the law.


Your Elder is praying for you and other members of your Zone. Please feel free to contact your Elder when you have a prayer request or want to talk with someone.

NEW HOPE FOOD PANTRY

For the month of November, New Hope Food Panty served an additional 39 families, 117 people, and gave out two Bibles. These figures were not included in those that were reported last month. In December we served 41 families, 152 people, gave out two Bibles and six packages of diapers. We also gave out 40 Christmas food baskets. The year-end totals are 578 families served, 2030 people, 589 units, and we gave out 108 Bibles and 50 packages of diapers.

New Hope receives most of our food from the county, which we pick up the first and third Wednesday morning of each month at their warehouse at Hall Road and Groesbeck. This requires a truck. Unfortunately, we no longer have a truck available and are in need of anyone who can help us. The food is loaded for us, and we have volunteers who help unload at the church. We would greatly appreciate your help. If you have

questions or can volunteer, please contact Joanne Vollbrecht.

Only personal care items (bar soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo) are needed at this time if you would like to donate.

Please consider joining New Hope. New people are always welcome. Our next meeting unteers is Saturday, February 3, at 10:00 a.m.

Dear Holy Cross Members,

I am under a doctor's care and have had some tests run. The tests show some wear in both of my hips and narrowing of the discs in my lower back. I just went through a test to check blood flow in my legs and that came back as all good. At this time I am not sure what the doctor will recommend as to what tests I need to have done next.

My main concern in this whole matter is while assisting with the service and communion my legs may give out while stepping down from the steps to the communion rail. This could result in serious injury not only to myself but as well as the person kneeling at the communion rail. To make matters worse is if I were carrying the tray of Individual cups.

After much prayer and careful thoughts about this matter I decided for the interest of not only my personal safety and those around me that it would be best for all for me to retire my position as deacon here at Holy Cross.

It has been an honor and a privilege to have served you all these past nine years. I am turning my deacon duties over to Deacon Larry and pray you all will support him as you have supported me.

Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML)

Clark Park Street Ministry= \$5,000, Mission Grant #6 Family of God Lutheran Church is

a non-profit Lutheran ministry committed to bringing the gospel to the lives of those living in Southwest Detroit. They are committed to building relationships with those they serve and offering programs that support them physically, spiritually, and emotionally.

One such way is through their Lunch Bag program which they started in 2020 during the pandemic. In their efforts to continue to do ministry within the confines of the Covid-19 restrictions, Family of God began delivering food to area residents. They also noticed large gatherings of homeless and addicted people in Clark Park who would be waiting for the FOG team at the same time each day. These gatherings turned into opportunities for prayer and a worship service.

Family of God realized they needed a place to store essential items year-round for basic hygiene needs, a tent, and a propane heater. They applied for and received an LWML Mission Grant for \$5,000 to help them purchase a used trailer to store these essentials.

We here at Holy Cross have been a part of this ministry by making and delivering lunch bags to Family of God since 2020. We are serving these residents as Christ Our Lord has first served us. Thank you, Holy Cross members and please continue to contribute to your mite box to help fund this grant.

<u>Women's Small Bible Study</u> will be Saturday, February 10, 2024, at 9:30 am in the conference room. We are using the book, Promised Rest, Finding peace in God's presence by author Michelle Diercks. This is a study on the various names and characteristics of God to deepen your understanding of Him and your identity as His child. 
A few thoughts for this month.
